Since parents are now educating in-home, we are sharing with you amazing, fun and educational ways to teach your children about Arbor Day, in-home or from your front porch!

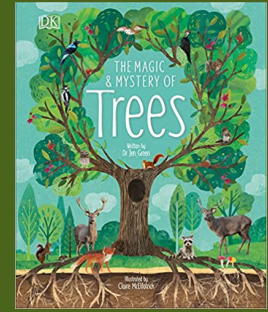
### 1. Read a Book About Trees!

**2. Grow Your Favorite Plants at Home!** Grab packets of seeds, small pots and mini bags of soil and spend the day teaching your children about plant growth and care!

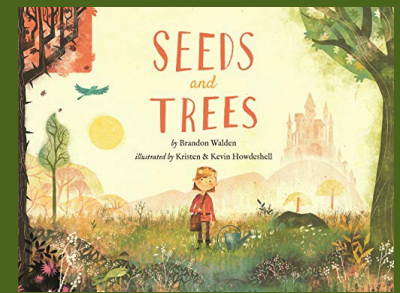

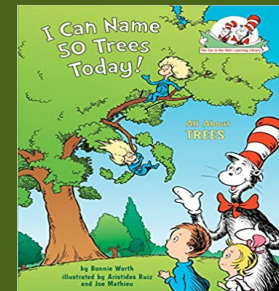
